Message From the Director

t Capstone we believe that everyone deserves the opportunity to realize their potential. Recognizing that potential and supporting people to achieve it is at the heart of what we do.

Often, this starts with stabilizing someone's life situation; helping a homeless family to secure a stable home or providing emergency food or heating assistance to a family in need. Once we help provide them with stability, they can then have the capacity to set meaningful goals and implement a plan to meet those goals. By creating housing security, eliminating hunger, ensuring safe and healthy homes through crisis fuel assistance and weatherization services, and by providing essential early childhood education and development, our staff works to provide the foundation for people to move forward and the tools and resources to transform their lives.

We have an amazing team of individuals to move individuals and families to economic sustainability. For example, in 2016, **308 Vermonters received financial and credit counseling** to improve their credit scores and become banked. Walk through downtown Barre and you will see Morse Block Deli, Maria's Bagels and Bob's Camera. These business owners got their start through our Micro Business Development program. This past year we worked with **225 people** and helped launch 18 new businesses, **creating 34 full time jobs** and leveraged an astounding **\$853,000 in financing** from local institutions.

The talents and commitment of volunteers through our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program enabled Capstone to **assist 1,292 Vermonters** in filing state and federal tax returns. These taxpayers reaped over **\$1.4M in state and federal tax refunds** that went back into our local economy. Finally, we **trained 29 students for a career** in the culinary industry in our Community Kitchen Academy with **93% securing jobs or pursuing further education.**

As you read through this report and the stories of some impressive people we've had the privilege to work with, please take pride in the impact your support has had. Lasting change is possible because of you and hundreds of community members who believe in the promise of human potential.

Act to Defy the Odds: Once Teen Parents Now Building a Life of Prosperity

We first met Shelby at age seventeen and five months pregnant when she came to our Family Literacy Center, Capstone's innovative education and childcare program for pregnant and parenting teens. Here, Shelby completed her high school education and received important prenatal and parenting counseling and mentoring. Plus, her son enrolled in Capstone's Early Head Start program for early child development, just downstairs from mom.

While in school, Shelby and her now husband Miguel also accessed our financial capabilities coaching on how to budget, save and build their credit.

In 2015, Shelby and Miguel got married. Miguel got a job with the US Postal Service and they set upon their next goal: buying their own home. So, they accessed our matched savings program, "Tangible Assets," where they earned a **\$2,000 match to the \$1,000 they saved — \$3,000 to go towards home ownership.**

This past summer, Shelby and Miguel bought and moved into their home with their son.

Act to Create More Sustainable and Healthier Homes

In 2016 172 households received Capstone's comprehensive Weatherization services, including insulation, air sealing, appliance upgrades and more. This work not only creates a tighter, more efficient space, it mitigates health risks caused by mold, moisture and cold drafts. So, we not only significantly reduce the energy costs of the house and the use of fossil fuels, we create living environments where kids are getting sick less and missing less school and seniors on modest fixed-incomes have a safe, more energy efficient home where they don't have to choose between food, heat and medications.

Act to Succeed: Maria's Bagels— Helping to Revitalize Barre One Bagel at a Time

Dustin Poitras always dreamed of having a business in downtown Barre; the town he grew up in. A few years ago he zeroed in on opening a bagel shop. The only problem was, "I knew nothing about making bagels," Dustin states. Still, he was determined to succeed.

Dustin turned to Google and YouTube to address his lack of bagel-making knowledge. Working with a friend, he started reading up on techniques and watching videos and began experimenting with recipes in his apartment.

Dustin was doing this on his spare time. To commit himself completely to the business, Dustin needed to do more serious planning and leg work. So he drafted a business plan and began talking with local business owners for advice. "They all kept telling me to talk to Capstone."

Capstone's Micro Business Development program helps individuals with the business planning process. This includes creating a business plan, tracking income and expenses, recordkeeping, pricing and profit, developing marketing plans and accessing financing. Dustin worked with program coordinator, Margaret Ferguson, as well as Laura Sudhoff.

However, Dustin's biggest barrier to realizing his dream was his credit, which was preventing him from getting financing. Margaret and Laura suggested he seek out private investors instead. Dustin did that and secured a significant loan from an angel investor. In October 2015 he opened his eatery, Maria's Bagels, in downtown Barre.

While the restaurant is doing well in its first year, Dustin believes the business' real success will be in the wholesale market and with mini-bagels, in particular. Dustin learned how to make mini-bagels that meet federal portion size standards for public schools and began selling them to U-32 and Barre City schools. This past fall, he landed a contract with a food service provider to distribute his bagels to **100 schools across VT, NH and NY.** He's now producing **12,000 bagels a week** for schools, in addition to those he's selling in local stores and at his eatery.

Dustin now **employs 5 staff** and it is clear that he is pleased with what he's been able to accomplish so far. "No one thought I could do this. People saw me as a goof ball, a screw up. But I was determined to do it," he says. But what is most evident is the pride Dustin takes in his hometown and his own place in it. "I love this town. I wouldn't move even if I was a billionaire. I want to be part of the revival."

Act to Advocate: **Educational Success Starts at Home**

"Head Start is not just about the child; it's about the whole family," states Michael Deering. "If the family is doing well then the child is able to do well in school."

Michael and his wife, Cassandra, have three children (2, 4 and 7) who have participated in Head Start and Early Head Start education and child development programs. A specific Head Start team member also visits their home each week to talk about goals for their children, each parent and the family. At regularly coordinated family outings the Deerings engage socially and build community with other parents striving to achieve positive growth for both their children and themselves.

Two years ago, Michael joined Capstone's Head Start Policy Council, or school board, and was recently elected Policy Council President. "To know that you have a voice, not only in your child's education, but in Capstone and the Head Start program, you feel a sense of ownership for that. For me it's very important to have a sense of ownership over my child's education."

Cassandra recently enrolled in our Family Literacy Center for pregnant and parenting teens and young adults to get her high school diploma. As a parent of three, attending school, working, and volunteering for Head Start, Cassandra is a role model for her younger classmates.

Act by Transforming Lives



Community Community Kitchen Academy is an innovative culinary training program that trains at-risk individuals for a

career in the food service industry. In partnership with the Vermont Foodbank, students use food that would be wasted and turn it into wholesome, packaged meals served through Capstone's food shelf.

Students receive 340 hours of total training led by a head chef instructor. Students receive the distinguished industry certification, ServSafe, and 9 hours of college credits towards further education.

In 2016 the program graduated 29 students; 27 (93%) got a job or enrolled in advanced education or training. Students prepared 36,437 ready-to-heat meals served through our food shelf.
